









HELP THE DRIVER FINISH HIS ROUTE!

At the MRF all materials are run through a series of machines and sorting lines to separate all the recyclables from the garbage. Once this is done all the recyclables are shipped off to be given a new life as other products!







A **cart** is the smallest size collection container and has 2 wheels and a lid. Carts are mostly used at houses. Carts can also be called cans.



A **side loader truck** has a grabber arm that reaches out, picks up the carts, and dumps the material into the body of the truck.



A **bin** is a medium-sized collection container with 4 wheels and a lid that is used at businesses and apartments. Bins can also be called dumpsters.



A **front loader truck** has arms that reach forward to pick up the garbage and recycling bins from businesses and apartments.


yard trimmings: tree branch, leaves, tlowers
















ROLL OFF TRUCK




A **roll off truck** picks up one large box at a time of mixed debris from construction and demolition sites.



A **street sweeper** comes through neighborhoods and cleans up the streets. Street sweepers have a giant vacuum to collect small debris and particles from the street.


SIDE LOADER TRUCK

REAR LOADER TRUCK




A **rear loader truck** has a big open back where the contents of carts, bins or claw loaders can be dumped.


CLAW LOADER TRACTOR



A **claw loader tractor** is a tractor with a pick-up claw to collect piles of yard waste that are set out on the side of the street.




An **excavator** is used to load debris onto a processing conveyor or into a grinder for more sorting before it is put into windrows.




A **dump truck** is used to move ground-up yard waste and leaves from the grinder out to the windrows for composting.

WHAT HAPPENS TO YOUR YARD TRIMMINGS?


STEP 1: They are collected by GreenWaste Recovery and delivered to our Material Recovery Facility (MRF), in San Jose, to be processed into compost.




STEP 2: The leaves and branches are ground-up in a large grinder.




STEP 3: Next, the the ground-up leaves and branches are loaded into a large transfer trailer, then transported to Z-Best Composting Facility in Gilroy, CA.



STEP 4: The leaves and branches are put in long piles called windrows. Windrows can be 12 feet tall and 400 feet long, which is longer than a football field!




STEP 5: The windrows are turned and mixed regularly and water is added. After 14-16 weeks, the leaves and branches have turned into compost and mulch to be sold to farmers to grow food and to landscapers to be used at houses and businesses.




FIND THE HIDDEN WORDS!
