Organics Recycling

Organics such as food scraps and yard waste decomposing in landfills contribute 20% of California's methane emissions, a greenhouse gas more potent than carbon dioxide. SB1383 is a statewide regulation aimed at reducing emissions and requires collection of food scraps along with yard waste in your green organics container.



YES

Yard Waste:

Organic material from your yard such as plant clippings, leaves, grass, and small branches.

Food Scraps:

Fruits, vegetables, bread, grains, cooked meats, bones, seafood, and cheese.

NO

Inorganic materials such as dirt, rocks, and plastic (e.g., straws, plastic bags) should not be disposed of in the organics container. Grease, greasy items such as soiled food containers, and raw meat should likewise not be composted.

TIP: If possible, refrigerate or freeze food scraps prior to putting them into the organics cart the night before collection to help keep pests and scents away.

Fall Cleanup Days December 4-8, 2023

Did you know that putting a "FREE" sign on something and leaving it on the curb is akin to illegal dumping? Illegal dumping is blight on our beautiful city, and a potential health and environmental hazard. With GreenWaste Recovery's curbside services, there's never a reason to dump illegally.

Take advantage of fall cleanup days, December 4-8, provided by GreenWaste Recovery. Dispose of ten (10) 32-gallon or equivalent bags of garbage not to exceed 70 lbs. each, and



bulky items or appliances up to two (2) per calendar year. If you've used your two (2) free bulky items for the year, fees may apply. All items must be curbside by 6:00 AM on your regular day of service. Household hazardous waste will not be accepted. To schedule a bulky item or appliance removal, please call GreenWaste Customer Service at 831.768.9505.

More options to bulky item disposal include donation, selling or giving away items in online marketplaces (such as NextDoor and Facebook), or holding a yard sale. Certain items are also accepted at the Buena Vista Landfill free of charge, like recyclable metal appliances, mattresses, and box springs.



Recycle Household Batteries

Batteries of any kind are prohibited from disposal inside the trash, recycling and organics containers. Prevent fires and environmental contamination; always dispose of batteries and other hazardous materials properly.

To recycle small household batteries, simply seal the batteries in a clear Ziploc bag and place the items on top (not inside) of your recycling bin when you set it out for collection.

Holiday Pickup Schedule

Collection does not occur on Thanksgiving Day November 23, Christmas Day December 25, or New Year's Day January 1. If an observed holiday falls on a regular collection day, collection for the remainder of the week will be delayed by one day. Please put your carts out for service by 6 a.m. on the collection day.
