CLEAN UP DAY PROGRAM

What is a Clean Up Day?

GreenWaste of Palo Alto offers single-family residents two free pre-scheduled Clean Up Days annually for the curbside collection of unwanted items. For more information visit www.greenwaste.com/palo-alto/cleanupday

When is my Clean Up Day?

Postcards containing specific Clean Up Day guidelines and a friendly reminder of your scheduled Clean Up Days are mailed to each single-family household, twice per year. Residents can also use the search function on our website to find their scheduled Clean Up Days.

How do I set out my items?

Be sure to first label items, bags, and boxes accordingly as "Reuse", "Landfill", "Clothing," etc. All items must be placed at the curb next to your carts by 6am on your scheduled Clean Up Day, no earlier than 24 hours.

ACCEPTED ITEMS:

- Bulky Items Up to 3, under 200lbs
- Individual Items Up to 3, under 60lbs, no larger than 3'x3'x3'
- Clothing & Textiles Up to 3, 32gal bags or boxes
- Recyclables Under 60lbs, no larger than 2'x3'
- Landfill Up to 3, under 60lbs, 32gal bags or boxes
- Construction Material 6 bags or boxes, under 60lbs, no larger than 2'x3'
- Household Batteries Sealed clear bag on top of recycle cart
- Motor Oil 3 spill proof 1gal containers, Oil filters in sealed clear bag

NOT ACCEPTED:

- Hazardous materials (paint, fluorescent light bulbs, treated wood, lithium batteries)
 Can be dropped-off at the Household Hazardous
 Waste Station.
- Fragile items (mirror)
- Food or Liquid

DISPOSABLE FOODWARE REQUIREMENTS

The City of Palo Alto adopted the Disposable Foodware Ordinance to protect local waterways and oceans from plastic pollution, reduce litter, and encourage Zero Waste. This affects food service establishments including restaurants, bars, delis, grocery stores, hotels, food delivery services, and anyone serving food in Palo Alto.

- » All disposable utensils, straws, stirrers, drink plugs, produce bags, and other small foodware provided must be reusable or acceptable in the City's compost collection program.
- » Single-use disposable foodware accessories must only be provided upon request or via a self-serve station.
- » Foodware or condiments cannot be bundled or packaged together. This eliminates the extra waste created when providing customers with a spoon and a knife when they only needed a fork.
- » Third-party delivery platforms and restaurants must list individual foodware items and condiments in their menu for customers to "opt-in" for online orders.
- » Condiments must only be provided upon request or via a self-serve station or refillable dispenser.

Look for compostable or reusable items while frequenting food service establishments or remember to bring your own reusable items to reduce your waste!
