# **SPOOKY AND SUSTAINABLE!**

Aim to be spooky and sustainable this Halloween and consider these zero waste tips:

#### **Pumpkins**

- While carving pumpkins, roast the seeds with some salt for a nutritious snack instead of tossing them out
- When the holiday is over, place your pumpkins into the green compost cart and be sure to remove all décor prior to disposal







#### Costumes

- Utilize face paints for creative characters instead of investing in a mask
- Wear a DIY, upcycled, borrowed, rented, or secondhand costume.
  Check out local costume swaps or thrift stores for awesome secondhand options

#### **Decorations**

- Choose natural decorations such as gourds, pumpkins, or leaves which can be composted and disposed of into the green compost cart
- Repurpose and upcycle household items into awesome décor such as making cardboard tombstones or using old sheets to make spooky ghosts

# FOOD WASTE REDUCTION

Avoid wasting energy, water, and other resources by practicing food waste reduction methods this Thanksgiving.



#### Make a Shopping List

 Make a shopping list with the meal in mind, including quantities to prevent overbuying

#### Plan a Leftovers Night

 Plan meals utilizing the leftovers from the holiday meal so everyone can look forward to another meal that helps reduce food waste

#### **Store Food in Clear Containers**

 You will eat what you can see, encouraging food use before it spoils. Clear containers in the fridge or freezer help prevent any confusion your household has about what's ready to eat

#### **Label Containers with Made-Dates**

 Make labels containing the description and madedate with tape and marker, or even a wax crayon.
Ensure that your culinary creations are enjoyed before they spoil
