Fully Automated Side Loader:



 For residential landfill collection
 Saves around 6,000 gallons of diesel and reduces emissions by about 78 metric tons of carbon dioxide equivalents annually, which is equal to removing 12

passenger vehicles from the road

Rear Loader:



- For residential Clean Up Day program
- Collects recyclable household items and can accommodate large items such as non-reusable furniture

Wash Truck:



- For commercial cart and bin washes
- Uses recycled water sourced from Palo Alto's Regional Water Quality Control Plant
- The truck's wash system is 100% self-contained, meaning there is no runoff!

Flatbed:



- For Clean Up Day program and refuse cart deliveries throughout the city

 The long truck bed allows for the collection of bulky items and transport of refuse carts

We are excited to welcome the addition of three more all-electric vehicles to Green Waste of Palo Alto's fleet by the end of the year – making a total of seven vehicles! This includes two fully automated side loaders and a roll-off truck, which would service large debris boxes. SORTING GUIDANCE: BULKY ITEMS

Bulky items are household items that weigh 200 pounds or less such as sofas, chairs, tables, mattresses, refrigerators, etc. Here are resources for reusing or disposing of these items:



Donate to local organizations so your bulky items can be reused. Search your bulky item on <u>resource.stopwaste.org</u> for guidance on local organizations and donation centers.


Utilize your free prescheduled Clean Up Days. Place your bulky items along the curb next to your carts by 6:00am on your scheduled Clean Up Day, no earlier than 24 hours prior to collection. Find the date of your next Clean Up Day by visiting www.greenwaste.com/paloalto/cleanupday and fill out the search function with your address and Palo Alto Utilities account number.

Schedule a bulky item pickup for a fee year-round. Contact GreenWaste of Palo Alto Customer Service at least one week in advance to determine cost and schedule a bulky item pickup on your next available refuse service day. Email pacustomerservice@greenwaste.com or call 650.493.4894

Self-haul bulky items to Shoreway Environmental Center. Shoreway Environmental Center is a recycling center and transfer station available for residents to dispose of a variety of materials including bulky items.

throughout their facility. With the guidance of GreenWaste of Palo Alto and Zero Waste Palo Alto, PAMF has worked diligently to improve their waste collection and sorting systems.

PAMF is dedicated to ensuring their waste is properly sorted throughout the facility by providing clearly labeled and color-coded waste stations for compost, recycle, and landfill – this includes all patient's room, exam rooms, cafeterias, and labs. By improving their waste stations, they've also doubled their compost collection throughout all their facilities. PAMF schedules annual trainings and events to help ensure all staff members and facility contractors are up to date on proper waste sorting practices. The campus is consistently monitoring their external refuse containers for contamination daily and has even adjusted their purchasing habits to decrease the amount of waste they put into the landfill container!
