GreenWaste Highlights

GreenWaste of Palo Alto will be closed on Christmas (December 25th) and New Years Day (January 1st). If your regular service day falls on or after one of these holidays, collection will be moved to the following day for that week. Regular collection schedules will resume the following week. BATTERIES NOT INCLUDED!

Batteries should be sorted separately as hazardous waste and never placed into your compost, recycle, or landfill containers. Batteries, especially lithium, lithium-ion, and small electronics with embedded batteries are hazardous and can ignite fires when crushed. Safe battery disposal isn't optional - it's critical!



If batteries mistakenly make their way into the waste trucks, they can get crushed and overheat – leading to fires inside of the waste truck while servicing the community or at the material processing facility. Battery-caused fires are becoming increasingly frequent, putting the safety of the drivers, facility workers, community, and environment at risk.

For proper and safe disposal of batteries year-round, businesses that generate less than 220 pounds of hazardous waste per month can participate in Palo Alto's Very Small Quantity Generator (VSQG) Program. Please contact the City of Palo Alto's hazardous waste contractor, Clean Harbors, at 800.433.5060 or send an email request to VSQG@cleanharbors.com for more information and to schedule an appointment. If your business does not qualify as a VSQG, please contact a hazardous waste company for proper disposal.

REDUCE AND REUSE RESOLUTIONS




Buy in Bulk: Buying in bulk can reduce packaging and need for reorders, which can save you money and reduce waste.

Invest in Reusables: Replace single-use breakroom items such as plastic utensils and straws, paper plates, and coffee pods with reusable utensils and straws, ceramic plates, and bulk coffee grounds. Provide a water filling station to promote reusable water bottles.

Establish a Zero Waste Team: Encourage employees to create a Zero Waste Team and become a Zero Waste Champion to lead waste reduction efforts and answer waste sorting questions. They can work with GreenWaste of Palo Alto to receive free signage and training for your staff.

EXTRA! EXTRA! EXTRA! PICK UP SERVICES



During the holiday season, there is significantly more waste produced causing refuse containers to overflow. Overflow material is a safety hazard as it restricts safe access to the bins and increases risk of material falling onto the truck, the driver, pedestrians and cars passing by during service. To reduce this safety hazard, please be sure that all material fits loosely inside your refuse containers with the lids completely closed. Do not place material on top of or next to any refuse container.

If your business needs additional service to avoid overflow, please contact GreenWaste of Palo Alto to schedule an extra pickup service for an additional fee.
