## ZERO WASTE HOLIDAY TIPS

During the holidays, let's work towards reducing waste! Consider our zero waste tips when planning your holiday festivities.

Purchasing Gifts: If you are ordering gifts from an online retailer, consider the amount of packaging that is required for shipping. Some retailers, such as Amazon, offer "frustration-free" packaging on certain products, which reduces the amount of packaging used and ensures each component is recyclable. Another option is requesting that all items be packaged together. If purchasing gifts in a store, you can look for retailers that offer package-free products and don't forget your reusable shopping bag!

To reduce waste even further this year, gift experiences, subscriptions, a holiday craft projects, or services instead of a physical gift. A museum visit, a trip to your favorite restaurant, or movie and theatre tickets are great alternatives.



**Gift Wrap:** The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency estimates that 1 million tons of wrapping paper end up in the landfill each year! Look for wrapping paper made of recycled paper or, better yet, wrap gifts in newspaper, magazines, paper bags, or scarves, which can make equally festive gifts. Keep intact gift wrap, ribbons, and decorations to use again next year!

Holiday Food: Reduce food waste by planning meals in advance, storing leftovers in clear containers, composting food scraps, and donating extra food. Try the GUEST-IMATOR tool for portion planning at www.savethefood.com. Shop your kitchen first – watch the Freestyle Cooking Workshop at www.cityofpaloalto.org/foodwaste to get tips on how to whip up something tasty with whatever you have handy.



Holiday Décor: Aim for reusable or natural décor items. For lighting, utilize LED string lights on trees or outdoor decorating which are reusable and have a long lifespan. For other decorations, invest in durable, reusable pieces or compostable natural decorations such as pine cones, real foliage, fruits, and vegetables.

## **HOLIDAY DECORATION HIGHLIGHTS**

• CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION: For the four weeks following Christmas Day, Christmas trees will be collected curbside. Christmas trees must be undecorated, unflocked, cut into fourfoot lengths with the stands removed, and placed curbside next to your green compost cart. Wreaths, garland, and other greenery must be undecorated, unflocked, removed of wiring and support systems, cut into small pieces, and placed in your compost cart.

Be mindful when choosing an artificial tree versus a real tree. Artificial trees are not recyclable or compostable and must be landfilled at the end of their life. Reuse your artificial tree for several years and be sure to donate it if you plan to replace it.






# WHAT PACKAGING IS RECYCLABLE?

### Mark your calendars for the holiday service schedule changes!
