



Starting July 1, 2025, the Ben Lomond Transfer Station CRV Redemption Center will not be available to accept CRV. However, starting January 1, 2025, any beverage retailer must either be in a dealer cooperative or will redeem CRV in store for customers.

Train your workers to redeem CRV at the register or another location on your property. Consider where and how you will receive CRV containers for redemption, and how to provide the cash or credit to customers. You may want to set up times you will accept CRV and how many items per person, and determine how to inform your customers. Train employees how to use the refund button on the register or another means to calculate and track redemptions.

You might want to work with other businesses in your area as to who will collect the CRV recyclables in the cart or bin. Check the CalReycle website for what is expected by the State.

CRV-eligible beverages are packaged in aluminum, glass, plastic and bimetal. Effective January 1, 2024, this includes wine, liquor and juice, and beverage containers that are boxes, bladders or pouches.

The CRV refunds are:

- 5 cents for containers less than 24 ounces
- 10 cents for containers 24 ounces or larger
- 25 cents for bag-in-box, multi-layer pouch, paperboard carton, plastic pouch



SANTA CRUZ COUNTY HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW) PROGRAM

Many common household products are legally defined as hazardous. If a product label has the words danger, caution, poison or "handle with care" then it's likely HHW. Items such as batteries, cell phones, computers, smoke detectors, solar panels and propane cylinders can pose a threat to human health, animals, and the environment when improperly used or disposed. Hazardous items cannot be disposed in the trash or recycling. The Household Hazardous Waste Collection Program with trained professionals provides the only proper way to dispose of hazardous products when they are no longer wanted.

HHW Collection Facilities are open FREE OF CHARGE to residents of the unincorporated County of Santa Cruz and the Cities of Scotts Valley, Capitola and Santa Cruz. Please bring proof of residency with you (e.g. driver license, utility bill). For locations and hours of operation, check our website at www.santacruzcountyrecycles.org.

When you buy batteries, check if they are alkaline or lithium. Knowing what type of battery you are buying can help you to know how to dispose of your used batteries. Always tape the two terminals on a 9-volt battery, and both ends of lithium batteries. If terminals touch each other or other metal, they could spark a reaction.





SANTA CRUZ COUNTY TAKE BACK PROGRAM

The Santa Cruz County Take Back Program allows you to take back certain hazardous items to a retail location for disposal, to save you a trip to the HHW Collection Facility.



SWAP SINGLE-USE TO REUSABLE

Recycling and composting are good, but are still resource- and labor-intensive processes to manage discards. HHW FOR BUSINESSES

Some businesses with small quantities of hazardous waste may qualify as Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generators (CESQG). Businesses generating hazardous waste in excess of the regulatory limits for CESQG may not use HHW County and City Facilities. The Program is designed to provide an inexpensive hazardous waste disposal option to these companies, non-profits and other entities instead of contracting with commercial hazardous waste.



COMPLIANCE REMINDERS

REMEMBER THE 25-CENT CUP CHARGE

Encourage customers to bring their own reusable cups. To help the County to significantly reduce the 5 million single-use cups thrown away every year, a 25-cent fee must be collected for any single-use cup (compostable or recyclable) distributed by your business. Reporting to the County of Santa Cruz tax collector quarterly is required to distribute the 12.5 cents per cup, to help pay for illegal dumping cleanup. The remainder of the charge shall be retained by the seller.



ENVIRONMENTALLY ACCEPTABLE PACKAGING

For carryout bags. paper must be made of 40% post-consumer paper. Reusable plastic bags must be 4 mil or greater. Only recyclable or BPI-certified compostable carryout containers and service ware are allowed.



SORT IT OUT

AB 827 requires that businesses provide customers and employees with access to Recycling and Organic collection bins in direct proximity to Garbage bins, with clear signage to assist in proper sorting.



SKIP THE STUFF

California law AB 1276 requires all retail food facilities and food delivery platforms to provide single-use foodware accessories and condiments upon request only. This includes ramekin cups, utensils, chopsticks, stir sticks, straws, and condiment pouches.



ORGANICS DIVERSION

To help California reduce our production of climate pollutants, SB 1383 requires diversion of edible food to food-recovery programs, and separation of food scraps and plant matter from the garbage.
